In Emacs, cutting and pasting text is called killing and yanking. Killed items can be yanked back into the buffer at any point with the yank command, C-y. This is the preferred method of moving text. You can yank the text any number of times. M-y will bring back previous kills. The region is the text between point (the cursor) and mark.
