The Karpov Variation is a great way for black to challenge white's main line against the Caro-Kann. Instead of going for Bf5, the most common move, Nd7 is a great alternative.

The Caro-Kann has served as a concrete defensive system against 1. e4 and has been played by World Champions including Jose Capablanca, Vasily Smyslov and Anatoli Karpov. It is a safe and solid set-up for Black which may lead to better endgame chances due to superior Pawn structure."

## **Chess openings: Caro-Kann (B10)**

Karpov is a very practical player, who has a mysterious ability to use his opponent's energy against him. He often does not mind getting a small theoretical disadvantage, as long as the opponent faced a difficult task. Here is one typical Caro-Kann victory from him. In the 1974 semi-final to the world championship he faced Boris Spassky.

The Caro-Kann is a common defence against the King's Pawn Opening and is classified as a " Semi-Open Game " like the Sicilian Defence and French Defence, although it is thought to be more solid and less dynamic than either of those openings. It often leads to good endgames for Black, who has the better pawn structure.

In all likelihood, Mikhail Podgaets is the principal author; his name appears on the cover under Karpov's. When Karpov co-authored The Caro-Kann in Black and White with Beliavsky, the first thing he covered under the Panov was a transposition into "The Karpov Variation" of the Nimzo. The transposition isn't even mentioned in this book.
